## Facility Details for Wastewater

### Describe the Current Facility before Improvement

The existing WWTF consists of three major components, the first is a headworks building with trash and grit removal, a laboratory, blowers, the treatment process controls, and chemical feed equipment. Next is the 96,000 gpd treatment process unit, which is an AeroMod, Inc. SEQUOX, modular treatment system with a dual process train and a decant storage tank with discharge pumping equipment. The treated wastewater is discharged to groundwater through 39,000 square feet of Rapid Infiltration Basins. The WWTF is permitted at 96,000 gpd and currently peaks at about 80% capacity during the summer tourist season. The existing collection system encompasses primarily the commercial properties along the S. Straights Highway. It is primarily gravity sewer with a few duplex pumping stations and associated force main piping. There are two main pumping stations that transport the wastewater from the service area to the WWTF. The WWTF is located on southeasterly of the service area, on the east side of I-75 approximately 1.5 miles from the service area.

### Describe the Current Facility after Improvement

In regard to the WWTF, Phases I and II of the proposed project will each add about 48,000 gpd to the existing plant capacity for a total of 192,000 gpd using the same AeroMod SEQUOX proprietary technology. There will be modifications to the headworks for additional grit and screening capacity associated with the higher influent flow rate, modifications to the chemical feed equipment, and integration of the additional treatment process equipment into the existing SCADA and controls. The additional discharge will require another 39,000 sft of rapid infiltration bed area, installed adjacent to the existing beds, roughly 50% of which would be installed in each of the two phases. In regard to the collection system, there will be a new sewer district added, District 2, which encompasses the area westerly of the existing sewer District 1 between the Columbus Beach Club at the north end, Sturgeon Island at the South, and Burt Lake to the east. District 2 will include 420 new EDUs, primarily single-family home connections. All properties will be provided with gravity sewer leads. In the area between the Sturgeon and Indian Rivers, inland from the Burt Lake Shoreline, the homes will connect to typical 8-inch gravity sewer. In the shoreline areas, where gravity sewer is cost prohibitive, low pressure sewer will be provided with gravity sewer services connected to duplex pumping stations installed in the right-of-way. The collection system extension would add approximately 18,500 feet of gravity sewer with over 50 manholes, over 15,000 feet of force main piping with ancillary equipment, 10 lift stations, 23 new duplex pumping stations and an upgrade to add capacity to both of the existing main sewer pumping stations.

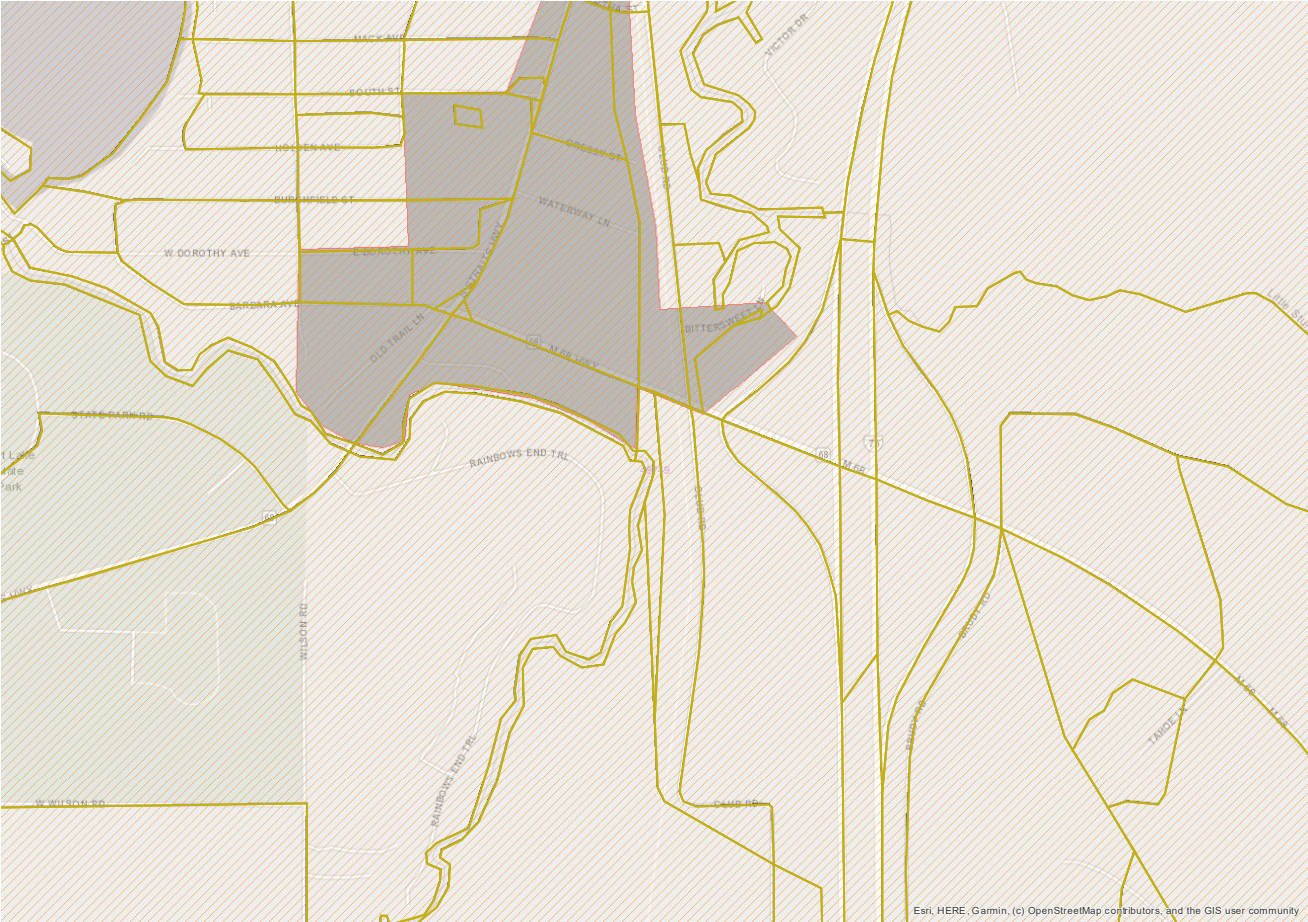

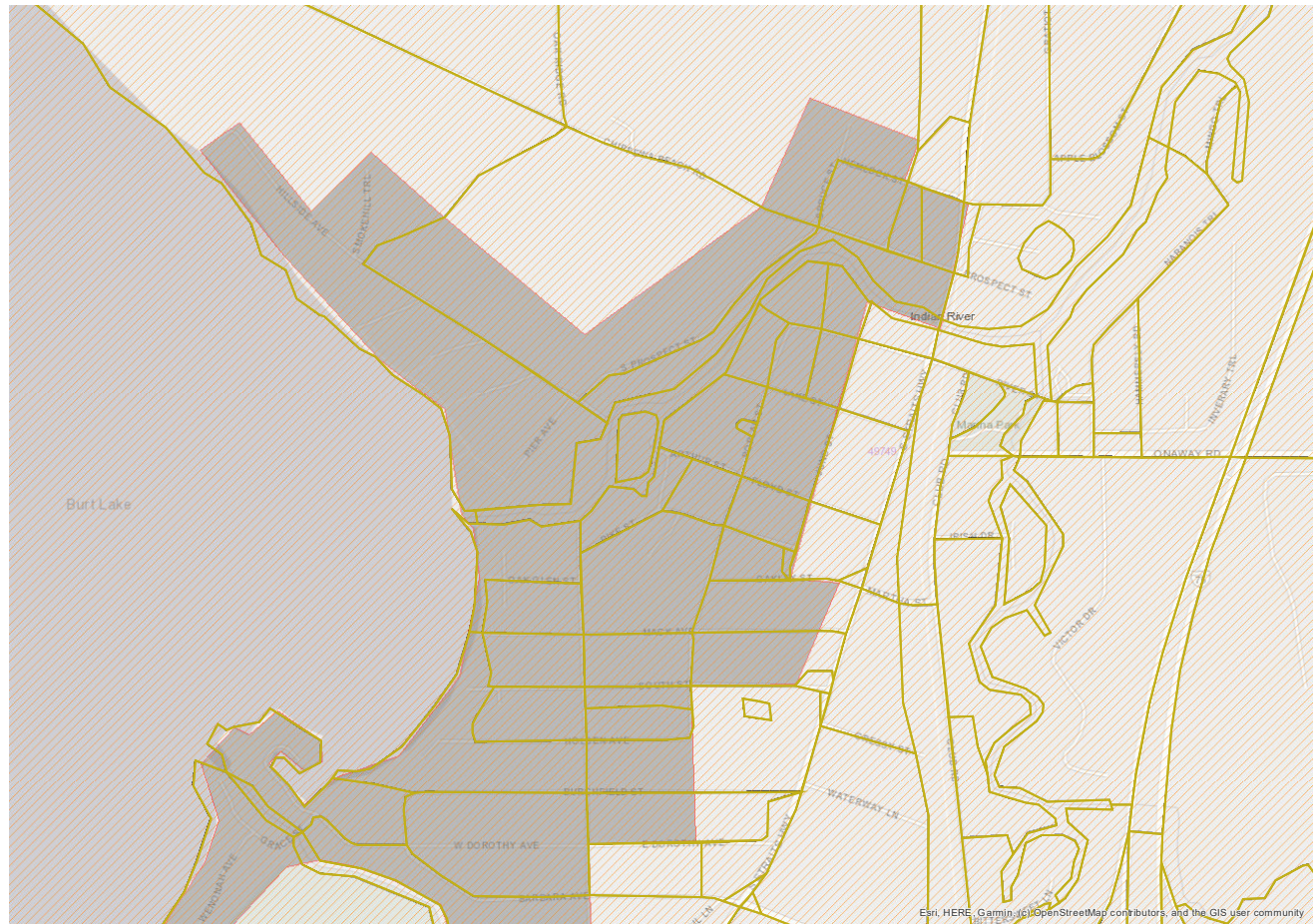
